

NATIONAL PEACE CONFERENCE PROPOSAL - 1944

DISPLACED PERSONS - 1945

Whereas, the Executive Board of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods is greatly moved and distressed by the plight of Displaced Persons throughout the world, among them thousands of fellow Jews, and

Whereas, it does not feel that the tempo of improving the conditions under which they live is moving forward at a pace sufficiently rapid to save from suffering and death large numbers of them,

Therefore, be it resolved, that this Board, convened in executive session on December 10, 1945, in Cincinnati, petition President Truman to use his good offices to facilitate more adequate food, clothing and shelter for Displaced Persons, pending their resettlement, and further, that both for their sake and the general welfare of mankind, urge upon the American Government, and through it upon the United Nations, the raising of immigration quotas throughout the world in order to ensure a more free flow of humanity to countries of choice, and

Be it further resolved, that once again we earnestly plead with the conscience of mankind to the end that there shall be opened the gates of Palestine to those Jews who desire to settle there.
