Whereas, all Jews by tradition and heritage deeply and sincerely believe in freedom for all men, and Whereas, the United Nations is the great hope of a free and united world and of all minority groups everywhere, and

Whereas, forces of evil abound in our world today directed toward the destruction of the United Nations,

Therefore, be it resolved, that the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, in Biennial Convention assembled in Chicago, Illinois, November 17-20, 1963, urge every Sisterhood and every individual Sisterhood member to reaffirm her faith in the principles of the United Nations, and

Be it further resolved, that to this end each Sisterhood learn to understand the meaning and impact of the United Nations through study of the United Nations including its many specialized agencies and bodies that so deeply affect the lives of men everywhere and some of which are: International Bank for Reconstruction and Development; FAO (Food and Agriculture Organization); IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency); ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organization); ILO (International Labor Organization); UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization); UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund); UPU (Universal Postal Union); WHO (World Health Organization); WMO (World Meteorological Organization), and

Be it further resolved, that each Sisterhood pledge its unremitting efforts to support and further the aims of the United Nations to achieve a peaceful world.
